ACTING PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGES:

SCIENCE ROADSHOW – Rooms 3-6

The Science Roadshow is a touring exhibition of demonstrations and hands-on interactive exhibits teaching students about science and technology. It provides an exciting and stimulating blend of science-technology education and entertainment. Each year the Roadshow tours with an entirely new programme of over 60 hands-on exhibits, two informative and entertaining demonstrations and various resources/activities for schools. The Roadshow challenges visitors to ask questions and to seek answers about the world around them.

The programme for 2017 involves a 1 hour 20 minute session, which includes:

The Hidden World - Aspects of the world that cannot be seen without the aid of special equipment;
Spectacular Changes - A look at physical & chemical changes ...

Plus a range of over 60 interactive exhibits under the themes of **Electricity, Gravity, Heat, Human Performance, Magnetism, Observations.**

This show is visiting school on Monday 10 April. The cost per student is \$4.00, whilst the school will subsidise the balance. Please ensure you send this fee along to school as we want every student to enjoy this experience, however only those who have paid will be able to take part.
