PB4L - POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

Please check out the attached information regarding our school being a PB4L school. PB4L revolves around our Kio Kio POWER Values where we promote students displaying positive behaviour in everything they do inside and outside the classroom.

We will be trialling a new behaviour management flowchart plan when particular behaviours occur. If you require further information, please contact your child's teacher.

STUDENTS ENTERING AND LEAVING SCHOOL

Please make sure that your child/ren are dropped off and collected from the bus shelter each day.

Please avoid using the front gate closest to the office for safety reasons.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP ROLES 2024

Each year our senior students in years 7 and 8 are given various leadership roles such as school councillors, house leaders, first aid monitors, librarians, enviro team, bus monitors, etc...

Students are given the opportunity to apply for these roles, as they run for the whole year.

This year our staff have the difficult job of selecting 8 student councillors from a group of students who applied for this position. Fortunately, those students who miss out have the opportunity to take on other leadership roles within our school.

PEANUT ALLERGY

We have a student in Totara class with a severe peanut allergy who cannot come in contact with **peanuts or products with peanuts in them.** We are asking that parents do not send peanuts or any peanut related products to school, so that we can keep this student safe. Thank you for your understanding.

START OF THE SCHOOL DAY

The official teaching day begins at 9.00 am and ends at 2.55 pm. Our bus students arrive at school close to 8.30am. We prefer that students are dropped off from 8.30am onwards as staff are preparing for the day and may not be able to supervise students.

Under special circumstances we will accept students arriving at school earlier than this through consultation with your child's teacher.

TREE CLIMBING

Our students are allowed to climb selected trees at school with permission from parents. This consent occurs when a child is enrolled. If you do not want your child to climb trees, please let your child's teacher know as soon as possible.

We have rules around climbing trees, especially around the height they can climb to and the size of the branches to walk on.

CLASS SWIMMING

All classes are swimming daily as part of the physical education swimming programme. Students are required to bring their togs & towel to school each day. If your child cannot swim for any particular reason, please send a note or message to your child's teacher.

SCHOOL POOL

This is still available for families to use after school and on the weekends. The cost to purchase a key is \$75. See Shirley, our Office Manager, who will have some paperwork for you to fill out prior to purchasing a key.

REMINDER for families using the pool:

- Please leave the door unlocked for access to the toilets
- A first aid kit is available in the cupboard on the left hand side of the corridor
- Please ensure young children are wearing appropriate clothing to stop any toileting issues occurring in the pool
- Lock the gate if you are the last group leaving

BREAKFAST CLUB



Our breakfast club will run on Monday - Thursday each week beginning at 8.30am. All students are welcome to receive a bowl of milk and weetbix before settling

in for the day's work. Thank you to our parent helpers who have volunteered again to run the programme.

Kio Kio is a PB4L school. But what is PB4L?

'PB4L' stands for Positive Behaviour for Learning

PB4L initiatives help us to address behaviour, improve children's well-being, and increase educational achievement.

By strengthening relationships and creating more positive school environments, we remove barriers to engagement and improve students' chances to achieve at school and beyond.

PB4L is a systematic approach involving a range of initiatives.

Some initiatives we use at Kio Kio School are...



P.O.W.E.R Cards

These are given out to students who are showing the P.O.W.E.R values in a range of settings, e.g. at lunchtimes, sports events, whole school singing, etc.

These are counted each week and are added as House

These are counted each week and are added as House Points. 5 or more are drawn out at each assembly and those drawn get a treat!

P.O.W.E.R values

These are explicitly taught in and out of class.
You will also see these characters and our expectations on walls around the school.





Classroom Heroes


Each classroom has a superhero themed behaviour chart. These are used throughout the day. When students are spotted showing the P.O.W.E.R values or positive behaviour/learning they move their peg up. Getting to the top (Classroom Heroes) helps them to earn stickers for their P.O.W.E.R chart. Pegs can also be moved down if required.



P.O.W.E.R Reward Charts

Every child at Kio Kio School has a P.O.W.E.R chart displayed in their classroom. Stickers are added to these throughout the day to reward 'Positive Behaviour'. When students complete half of their chart they can choose a special pencil or pencil sharpener. When they complete a full chart they can choose something out of their classroom prize box. Completed charts are awarded at Whole School Assemblies.





This flow chart outlines the process all teachers/staff will follow when negative behaviours arise.


