Home Learning for the Whole Family!

Our Science initiative Project for 2021 is to 'grow' the trees associated with our classrooms. We have started the process by making a seed/seedling raising bed in one of the gardens at school.



We are now needing to collect seeds. Now is the time.

One of the important things to remember when collecting seeds is to collect them from mature trees that have been naturally produced.

Please send along any seeds you are able to collect from the area in a clearly labeled envelope. NB: You can collect ANY of the 7 seed types. Children from each classroom will be involved in the growing process throughout the year.

- Kauri best to collect the actual cone off mature female trees. These eventually break open to reveal the seeds
- Kahikatea can be picked directly off the tree or picked up from the ground
- Rimu bright red fleshy cones
- Pohutukawa tiny threadlike seeds
- Totara rather than seeds, cuttings can be taken from the semi-hardwood part of the branch
- Kowhai plentiful at this time of the year
- Puriri please collect and send along any of the fruits from the puriri. We can then work with children on revealing/cleaning the inner seeds.

If you are unsure how to go about finding/collecting the seeds, google has many great videos that will help you.

It will be a slight step up from our current junior class, but not a huge leap to senior level. The classes are structured for the opportunity to work towards and earn GymFun badges recognising achievement of basic gymnastic skills.




Book Week Dress up Day
