VACCINE MISINFORMATION

A number of parents have asked me if our school would allow the Ministry of Health to come onto our site and vaccinate students without parental consent. The answer is **NO**.

It is up to parents to decide whether they want their children to receive the COVID vaccination or not. Schools certainly do not make that decision.

Unfortunately, there are people who are distributing all sorts of information to communities, which at times, is not very helpful. Especially, when it is not factually correct. Thank you to those parents who got in touch with me and have been given the correct information.

COVID PREPARATION

You will no doubt be keeping up with the latest Coronavirus news. There are a number of schools in the Waikato who are affected by students or staff who either have the virus or have had close contact with someone with it.

If we are informed of anyone in our school community (parents, students or staff) who has the virus, we will inform the Ministry of Education who will quickly advise us of our next steps. This could mean a number of staff, or students self-isolating at home and returning to school after receiving a negative test result. Most schools have remained open whilst dealing with community cases. Also, if you are a close contact with someone who has received a positive test result, please inform us immediately of the advice you have received from the Ministry of Health.

VACCINE PASSES

At present school camp sites and the local pools are requiring adults attending to have a vaccine pass. These requirements are out of our control, but we feel that it is important that our students are able to continue their schooling in the best way possible. Camps are treating their sites like a school setting for those schools attending. If parents are asked to assist with students on our school camps, they have to be fully vaccinated.

SCHOOL CAMPS

Notices are starting to go home regarding students attending camps. Your child's teacher will be asking for parent helpers and permission for your child to attend. The requirements for parents attending will be outlined in the newsletters.

HEALTH UPDATE FORMS

Please keep an eye out for a health form sent home today. We ask that you read this and sign and return it to confirm that your child's health and contact details are correct. If not, please add the changes and return it to school.

PEANUT ALLERGY

We have a student at our school who has a severe peanut allergy. We ask that you do not send any peanut related products in your child's lunch boxes.

PARENT HELP LIST

Could you please return this form which went home last week, back to school as soon as possible. This will help us with our school organisation in 2022.

TREE CLIMBING

Our students are allowed to climb selected trees at school with permission from parents. This consent occurs when a child is enrolled. If you do not want your child to climb trees, please let your child's teacher know as soon as possible.

We have rules around climbing trees, especially around the height they can climb to and the size of the branches to walk on.

TOYS AT SCHOOL

We are asking that **all toys** are kept at home as we have already had a few issues with Pokemon cards. We end up with unfair trading, toys/games broken or going missing and upset students. Thank you for your understanding.

SCHOOL POOL

This is still available for families to use after school and on the weekends. The cost to purchase a key is \$75. See Rachel, our Office manager, who will have some paperwork for you to fill out prior to purchasing a key.

REMINDER for families using the pool :

- Please leave the door unlocked for access to the toilets
- A first aid kit is available in the cupboard on the left hand side of the corridor
- Please ensure young children are wearing appropriate clothing to stop any toileting issues occurring in the pool
- Lock the gate if you are the last group leaving

SWIMMING SPORTS

Our swimming sports will go ahead next week under guidelines set by the Otorohanga Pools. Today, students from 8 years and up will be bringing home a swimming sports organisation newsletter. It would be appreciated if you could fill this out and return it to school as soon as possible.

LOST PROPERTY

COVID PROTOCOL REMINDERS

Visitors to School

- No non-essential visitors on site.
- All visitors, including parents and caregivers, if they do come onsite should wear face coverings when on school grounds. Please only come into school if it is necessary to do so. For example, parents dropping off new or younger students.
- Parents will need to scan the NZ COVID Tracer QR code posters attached to the gates at the bus shelter when entering the school grounds. If you do not have the app on your phone, you must register your name at the school office.
- Do not enter the school grounds from the gate in front of the office and beside our mailbox.
- All visitors must maintain a safe distance from other students and teachers whilst on the school grounds.

Face Masks

- Face coverings must be worn when indoors by students receiving education in Years 4 and above and any staff member working to provide, or support the provision of, that education.
- Face coverings are not required to be worn in schools by staff or students, for Years 1 – 3.
- A pragmatic approach will be used for any situation where there are a mixture of year levels where some students are not required to wear face coverings, and others are. For example, if students are predominantly Year 3 with some Year 4 students also, face coverings could be optional.

- A pragmatic approach will be used for any high needs students. We will have any discussions with families if required. **Please name your child's mask.**
- Public health advice is that an appropriate face covering will fit snugly and seal well around facial contours. This can include single use, disposable masks (medical masks) and reusable fabric masks with three layers.

School Transport

• For all students Year 4 upwards face coverings are mandatory on school transport.

Physical Distancing

- Beyond classroom groupings physical distancing of 1 metre when indoors should be observed wherever practicable.
- Large groups of students meeting indoors should be avoided including assemblies, prize giving and performances.

Indoor Environment - Hygiene Practices

- Classes will be well-ventilated to provide fresh air to minimize risk for our students and staff. We will also be receiving a CO₂ monitor in the coming weeks to further support our ventilation plan.
- Hand sanitisers and soap will be provided for students to wash their hands.

Outdoor Environment

- Exercising and singing must be held outdoors.
- Physical education classes and break time activities can include access to sports equipment, but hygiene practices should be observed before and after playing with equipment. Students will be required to either wash their hands or use hand sanitiser before breaks and when returning to the classroom.
