STRUCTURED LITERACY - BOT REPORT

Last night Emma Telfer presented the student iDeaL Spelling Assessment data from Terms 1 and 2 to the Board of Trustees of our school.

These assessments included testing phonological awareness and alphabetic principles. The assessments enabled teachers to group students according to their needs and to identify students that were in need of additional support.

The improvements students have made between Terms 1 and 2 has been extremely pleasing.

In Term 1 next year, we will hold a Structured Literacy parent evening similar to the one done 2 years ago.

Thanks to Mrs Telfer and all our staff for your roles in delivering Structured Literacy lessons to our students each day. You have all made a massive difference to our students' achievement levels.

AGRICULTURAL DAY - TUESDAY 25 OCTOBER

For many years, Agricultural Day has been a huge part of our school culture. We always had large numbers of students bringing pets on this day, especially calves and lambs. This year the numbers of students not bringing pets is low with approximately a third of our students not bringing an animal. There are many reasons for this, and it seems to be a trend across schools. So this may be the last year that we run the Horticultural section for students, because most staff have jobs helping outside. Other schools are running a normal school day for those students, and it's highly likely that we will follow suit. Some schools are even running their Agricultural Day on a Saturday, and this could be a possibility.

All forms need to be returned to school ASAP or before next Friday (Last day of Term) the 30th September. This will help with the organisation of groups and events on the day. Our theme for the Horticultural Section is going to be 'Spring time'. Discussion groups have started and information booklets have been given to students today.

SPORTS CAMP DONATIONS

Totara Springs Sports Camp is an amazing opportunity for our senior students each year. This camp would not be possible without the generous donations from some of our local organisations.
