STUDENT ATTENDANCE

The percentage of students attending regularly was highest in Term 1 of 2023 (68.1%) and the lowest in Term 1 of 2022 (10.6%)

There has been a general concern across NZ with low attendance rates in primary and secondary schools. We certainly want our students at Kio Kio School to be attending school 90 - 100 % of the time. High attendance rates can equate to higher achievement levels across the curriculum.
